

Quality Tip of the Month



"To facilitate the timely diagnosis of STEMI patients, consider using evidence based 'Rapid ECG criteria' to help triage nurses identify which patients need an ECG within ten minutes of ED arrival. For example (Graff criteria): patients over age 30 with chest pain, and patients over



age 50 with shortness of breath, syncope, palpitations, and general weakness."

Frequently Asked Questions



Question:

How does our site claim Improvement Activity(IA) credit?

Answer:

E-QUAL will provide each ED site a certificate for use as evidence for any audit/attestation of the IAs completed by that site and the ECs/NPIs submitted to E-QUAL as working at that site. If your TIN includes multiple ED sites, then your TIN may receive multiple certificates of completion. Each TIN or EC will have to attest to IA completion to CMS unless they are using CEDR to submit quality measures and IAs. If you (TIN or EC) are using CEDR for quality reporting then CEDR will report completion of E-QUAL associated Improvement activities for you to CMS. Current CMS guidance regarding IA reporting is available on the **QPP website**.
