Debra G. Perina, MD, FACEP JOHN G. WIEGENSTEIN LEADERSHIP AWARD

Debra G. Perina, MD, FACEP, is Professor Emeritus of Emergency Medicine at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville, where she was Prehospital Division Director and EMS Fellowship Director for more than 20 years. She has spent decades working to advance emergency medicine, EMS, and ACEP though mentoring, training, and leadership. She led efforts to revise the Model of the Clinical Practice of Emergency Medicine and create the EMS Medicine Core Content. Dr. Perina authored the EMS Medicine subspecialty application, which achieved recognition by the American Board of Medical Specialties. She also spearheaded the creation of the first EMS Medicine Board certification examination.

Dr. Perina completed her medical training at West Virginia University School of Medicine in 1983 and her emergency medicine residency in 1987 at Richland Memorial Hospital/Palmetto Health Care University of South Carolina School of Medicine, remaining as faculty and subsequently becoming Residency Director prior to moving to Virginia in 1995. She is the former State EMS Medical Director for South Carolina.

Dr. Perina served on numerous ACEP committees. She served on the ACEP Board of Directors from 2012-2019 and was Chair of the Board from 2017-2018. She is Past President of ABEM and CORD. She served on the RRC-EM and as Chair of the Accreditation Council on Continuing Medical Education (ACCME). Dr. Perina has published more than 60 peer-reviewed articles, has given more the 80 scientific and didactic presentations and has served as principal investigator for several state and NHTSA federal grants.

Dr. Perina has been active in ACEP for more than 40 years, utilizing leadership and organizational skills to serve and develop emergency medicine in a variety of venues—education, training, EMS and trauma. She continues to serve ACEP and her community as a delegate to the AMA, a local medical examiner, medical director for several EMS services and volunteer fire departments and as a volunteer at her local free medical clinic. She continues to enjoy and indulge her passion for gardening.





Earl J. Reisdorff, MD, FACEP JAMES D. MILLS OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO EMERGENCY MEDICINE AWARD


Earl J. Reisdorff, MD, FACEP, is Executive Director of the American Board of Emergency Medicine (ABEM), a post he has held since 2010. Dr. Reisdorff is an author of multiple peer-reviewed articles and 17 chapters in eight different texts; he also is the co-editor of two key textbooks—Emergency Radiology and Pediatric Emergency Medicine. He has presented more than 300 scientific and didactic presentations in the United States and internationally.

His research interests have focused on physician assessment. In 2003, Dr. Reisdorff was appointed by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to the Council on Graduate Medical Education, an advisory group to both DHHS and the Congress on physician workforce and training.

Dr. Reisdorff has been a program director and a designated institution official and has led a multi-institutional Graduate Medicine Education consortium. He also has been a Motocross racer, a published and recorded composer, a silent film theater organist and an organist for professional hockey teams.

Dr. Reisdorff is board certified by ABEM and is meeting the requirements of the ABMS Continuous Certification program for his board. He attended medical school at the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine and completed his emergency medicine residency at Michigan State University in Lansing.





D.W. "Chip" Pettigrew III, MD, FACEP JOHN A. RUPKE LEGACY AWARD

D.W. "Chip" Pettigrew III, MD, FACEP, was born in El Paso, Texas and moved many times during his childhood, but he always had a home on the family farm in Arkansas.

Dr. Pettigrew joined the Army in July 1969 and attended the United States Military Academy at West Point where he earned Bachelor of Science in Engineering. He attended medical school at the University of Arkansas College of Medicine and completed an emergency medicine residency at Madigan Army Medical Center.

Dr. Pettigrew's Army assignments included positions as a line officer in an infantry division, in the US Army's elite special operations 1st Ranger Battalion (Airborne) and subsequent hospital assignments in clinical emergency medicine. Dr. Pettigrew's awards and certifications for service and deployments include airborne and Ranger certification, flight surgeon wings, medic badge, Army Commendation Medal, three Meritorious Service Medals and multiple other medals and ribbons.

After completion of his service obligation, Dr. Pettigrew was recruited to the Athens Regional Medical Center in Athens, Ga., where he was the first residency trained and board-certified emergency physician on staff. There, he started an independent, Democratic group which is still thriving.

Dr. Pettigrew has been active in ACEP state and national activities, including his service as President of the Georgia College of Emergency Physicians (GCEP) and 30 years as an ACEP Councillor. He has volunteered for multiple committee assignments in Georgia and ACEP. Dr. Pettigrew has twice received GCEP's leadership award and has also actively participated in the Medical Association of Georgia (MAG) and the Emergency Department Practice Management Association (EDPMA). In 2023, he was awarded EDPMA's highest award, the Meritorious Service Award.

Through GCEP, ACEP, MAG and EDPMA, Dr. Pettigrew has ceaselessly advocated for EM, resulting in multiple state laws benefiting Georgia's patients and emergency physicians.

Most recently, Dr. Pettigrew served on the Emergency Medicine Policy Institute's (EMPI) Board of Governors. As Chair, Dr. Pettigrew was instrumental in implementing the RAND Corporation's soon-to-be published Value of Emergency Medicine white paper.





Arjun K. Venkatesh, MD, MBA, MHS, FACEP PAMELA P. BENSEN TRAILBLAZER AWARD

Arjun K. Venkatesh, MD, MBA, MHS, FACEP, is a distinguished leader in emergency medicine, currently serving as Chair and Chief of Emergency Medicine at the Yale University School of Medicine and Yale New Haven Hospital. He has secured more than \$12 million in funding from prominent organizations, including the National Institutes of Health (NIH), Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). These funds have been instrumental in his efforts to develop measures and interventions aimed at improving acute care outcomes and enhancing the value of healthcare services.

Dr. Venkatesh has been a key contributor to health care quality improvement and has played a pivotal role in supporting CMS's development of the Overall Hospital Quality Star Ratings. This initiative helps patients and their families make informed decisions about health care by providing accessible and comprehensible quality information. Additionally, he has led the development of quality measures for the Clinical Emergency Data Registry, a critical tool in the ongoing effort to standardize and improve emergency care.

Dr. Venkatesh's expertise is further demonstrated by his role as the Principal Investigator (PI) of the Emergency Quality Network (E-QUAL). Under his leadership, E-QUAL has made significant strides in advancing emergency care quality across the nation. His dedication to improving health care outcomes is reflected in his extensive body of work with over 200 publications to his name. These publications have not only contributed to the academic field but also have been implemented in numerous national quality and value programs, influencing policy and practice on a broad scale.

Dr. Venkatesh completed medical school at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine, his emergency medicine residency at the Brigham and Women's Massachusetts General Hospitals and his Master of Health Science at the Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholars Program at Yale University.

Through his research, leadership and commitment to excellence, Dr. Venkatesh continues to drive significant advancements in emergency medicine, ensuring that patients receive the highest quality of care. His contributions have had a lasting impact on the field, and his work serves as a foundation for ongoing improvements in health care quality and value.





Susan B. Promes, MD, MBA, FACEP

JUDITH E. TINTINALLI AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION IN EDUCATION

Susan B. Promes, MD, MBA, FACEP, is a tenured professor at Penn State University Milton S. Hershey Medical Center and has served as Chair of the Department of Emergency Medicine since 2014. She has dedicated her career to emergency medicine and educating future physicians and emergency medicine leaders.

Dr. Promes is a graduate of Washington University in St. Louis, where she received her bachelor's degree with a double major in Biology and Spanish and a minor in Education. In 1991, she graduated from Penn State University College of Medicine in Hershey, Pa., and continued her emergency medicine residency at Alameda County Medical Center - Highland General Hospital, where she served as Chief Resident. She was recruited and hired as faculty. In 2001, Dr. Promes was selected as the inaugural Emergency Medicine Residency Program Director and Director of the Medical School Capstone course at Duke University. She was later recruited to the University of California at San Francisco, where she served as Vice Chair for Education, the inaugural Emergency Medicine Residency Program Director and Director of Curricular Affairs for Graduate Medical Education.

Her scholarly work has centered around topics related to EM medical education and clinical guidelines for practicing emergency physicians. In addition to numerous peer-reviewed publications, speaking engagements and committee service, Dr. Promes has edited multiple McGraw Hill board review books to prepare physicians for the emergency medicine board exam. She served on the Emergency Medicine RRC and currently is on the Board for the Association of Academic Chairs of Emergency Medicine. Promes directed the popular ACEP Teaching Fellowship for more than two decades.

Dr. Promes is an internationally recognized leader in academic emergency medicine and was chosen by the Society of Academic Emergency Medicine to be the editor of their new journal entitled Academic Emergency Medicine Education and Training. The journal debuted in January 2017 and has developed into a respected and frequently cited journal in the field of medical education. Dr. Promes was the recipient of the ACGME Courage to Teach Award and the 2020 Hal Jayne Excellence in Education award from the Society of Academic Emergency Medicine.

Dr. Promes is the wife of Mark Haynos, an emergency medicine nurse and is the proud mother of two sons, Alex Haynos, EMT, CNA, and Lt. Aaron Haynos.





Robert M. Rodriguez, MD AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION IN RESEARCH

Robert M. Rodriguez, MD, is a professor of emergency medicine and the Vice Chair of Research at the University of California at San Francisco Department of Emergency Medicine. After the University of Notre Dame and Harvard Medical School, he completed a combined emergency medicine/internal medicine residency at UCLA and a Critical Care Medicine Fellowship at Stanford.

Dr. Rodriguez has served as principal investigator on multiple RO1 and U grants, leading national teams examining issues in trauma, public health, and critical care. Recognizing the pivotal role that emergency departments play as the "safety net of the safety net," much of his research centers on emergency health care access for underserved populations. He has published more than 150 peer-reviewed original research articles in high impact journals, including 40 articles in Annals of Emergency Medicine and Academic Emergency Medicine.

Dr. Rodriguez considers his services as a research mentor to be his most important contribution to research. With a "Sí, se puede" attitude and a particular focus on under-represented in medicine trainees, he has mentored more than 210 students, residents, fellows, and junior faculty over the past 25 years. He is proud that 54 of his research mentees have garnered research funding, all his undergraduate mentees have continued to medical school or other health professional training programs and many of his advisees have continued onto careers in academic medicine.

He has received multiple mentoring awards, including the UCSF CTSI Mentor of the Year, the UnidosUS Latinx Excellence Award and the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Award, given to a UCSF faculty who best exemplifies the late leader's commitment to diversity.

Dr. Rodriguez served as an advisor to the Congressional Hispanic Caucus and is the only emergency physician on the Biden/Harris COVID-19 Transition Advisory team. He co-authored the book Lessons from the Covid War: An Investigative Report.





Sabina A. Braithwaite, MD, MPH, FACEP, FAEMS AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTING IN EMS

Sabina A. Braithwaite, MD, MPH, FACEP, FAEMS, currently serves as Medical Director of Patient Flow at the Veterans Administration Sierra Nevada Healthcare System and provides subject matter expertise in service to development of the VA National Emergency Ambulance Service program.

She happened into EMS as an undergraduate at Georgetown and became an EMT to confirm that medicine was the right path for her. Dr. Braithwaite volunteered as an EMT/firefighter with Fairfax County, then established a career and volunteer EMS system in Richmond while at the Medical College of Virginia. She became involved in ACEP while serving as Basic Trauma Life Support Medical Director in Virginia. She then served as a member of the Board of Directors and President of Virginia ACEP.

Dr. Braithwaite's first EMS Medical Director role was with Albemarle County Fire-Rescue after joining the University of Virginia EMS Fellowship faculty. During her time with ACFR, it grew from six BLS daytime first responders to a 100-plus provider ALS transport agency. She became a full-time EMS Medical Director with the Wichita-Sedgwick County Kansas EMS system, providing oversight to all components of the system. EMS offered an unparalleled opportunity to care for an entire community by putting in place progressive credentialing, protocols, and integration of city and county EMS-related services on many levels.

Dr. Braithwaite has been a leader in state, national, and international EMS organizations, including ACEP, the National Association of EMS Physicians (NAEMSP), Emergency Medical Service Provider (EMSP), International Trauma Life Support (ITLS), and the Committee on Accreditation for EMS Providers (COAEMSP). She has led several patient-safety related initiatives, co-authored multiple national position statements and peer-reviewed articles and participated on numerous national panels and projects.

Her greatest satisfaction has been the ability to pay forward the mentorship she received from so many prior ACEP EMS award honorees. Several of her providers, trainees and mentees continue to achieve as they help build EMS as a profession.

Dr. Braithwaite received a Master of Public Health Practice from the University of South Florida and received her medical degree from Virginia Commonwealth University School of Medicine in 1991. She completed her emergency medicine residency at Eastern Virginia University in Norfolk.





Brendan G. Carr, MD, MA, MS, FACEP

COLIN C. RORRIE, JR., PHD AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN HEALTH POLICY

Brendan G. Carr, MD, MA, MS, FACEP, is a nationally recognized leader in academic medicine and health policy. He currently serves as Chief Executive Officer and the Kenneth L. Davis, MD, Distinguished Chair at Mount Sinai Health System.

Mount Sinai Health System includes eight hospitals, the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai and more than 400 ambulatory locations and physician practices. Appointed to the role in 2024, Dr. Carr is a visionary physician-scientist who works to propel Mount Sinai to further success in its mission to provide compassionate patient care through unrivaled education, research and outreach in the diverse communities it serves.

Dr. Carr, who has practiced clinical emergency medicine for more than 20 years, is a renowned clinician and health policy researcher. He has focused on building regional systems of emergency care, has served in an advisory role to domestic and international organizations and is a member of the National Academy of Medicine.

Dr. Carr previously served on the faculty at the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania and as Associate Dean of the Sidney Kimmel Medical College at Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia. In addition to his academic accomplishments, Dr. Carr served the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services in a variety of roles focused on improving trauma and emergency care delivery for the nation, ensuring the ability to respond during large-scale threats to the public's health.





Tara Morrison, CAE, CMP DIANE K. BOLLMAN CHAPTER ADVOCATE AWARD

Tara Morrison, CAE, CMP, has been in association management for more than 25 years and has specific expertise in the management of medical associations, conference planning, and continuing medical education. She is President and CEO of Association Management Executives, Inc., a company she established in 2001 which represents professional medical associations and serves the needs of small to medium-sized medical associations needing professional staff.

Since that time, AME, Inc., has grown from one staff person to 15 and services clients with membership as small as 200 and as large as 3,000. Prior to starting AME, Inc., Ms. Morrison worked for the Medical Association of Georgia in their specialty society staffing department. She has been Executive Director of the Georgia College of Emergency Physicians for more than 23 years and Executive Director of the South Carolina College of Emergency Physicians for seven years.

She holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Vanderbilt University with a major in Human and Organizational Development. Thomas J. Sugarman, MD, FACEP COUNCIL MERITORIOUS SERVICE AWARD

Thomas J. Sugarman, MD, FACEP, FAAEM, is an emergency physician currently practicing in Indiana and is the Senior Director of Government Affairs for Vituity. He has been a member of the ACEP Council since 2006 and on the Steering Committee from 2022-2023. He is Past President of California ACEP, which honored him with the Walter T. Edwards Meritorious Service Award and the Chapter Service award.

Dr. Sugarman served as Chair of the Emergency Medicine Policy Institute (EMPI) and of ACEP's State Legislative and Regulatory Committee. He is a long-standing member of Emergency Practice Committee. Currently, he chairs EDPMA's Tact-C workgroup addressing NSA regulatory and legislative issues and serves as Treasurer of EMPI. Dr. Sugarman also is Past President of the Alameda Contra Costa Medical Society and past Co-Chair of the East Bay Safe Prescribing Coalition.

Dr. Sugarman graduated from Princeton University with a Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science. He attended medical school at the University of Illinois at Chicago, graduating with honors. Dr. Sugarman completed his emergency medicine residency at Harbor-UCLA and is board certified by the American Board of Emergency Medicine (ABEM). He is proud to be a Fellow of both the American College of Emergency Physicians and of the American Academy of Emergency Medicine.

Michelle P. Lin, MD, MPH, MS, FACEP POLICY PIONEER AWARD

Michelle P. Lin, MD, MPH, MS, serves as Associate Professor of Emergency Medicine and Director of the Acute Care Policy, Research, and Innovation Collaboratory at Stanford University. She is an emergency physician-scientist whose work strives to make emergency care more patient-centered, accessible and equitable. Dr. Lin leads the development of quality measures used by emergency physicians in federally mandated payment programs through her leadership roles in ACEP and the Emergency Medicine Data Institute (EMDI). She was previously a Fellow at the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Innovation (CMMI).

Dr. Lin's active NIH-funded research projects develop new quality measures based on what matters most to patients; improve post-ED discharge care, reduced admissions for high-risk patients and enhanced health professions workforce diversity and retention.

She is the sole emergency physician appointed to the All-Cause Admissions and Readmissions Standing Committee, with responsibility for issuing endorsement recommendations for all admissions and readmissions quality measures to CMS and national regulatory bodies.

Dr. Lin has received several national awards for her work, including the 2021 Society for Academic Emergency Medicine Young Investigator Award, the inaugural EMRA 45 under 45 National Influencers in Emergency Medicine recognition in 2019 and the AcademyHealth Presidential Scholarship for New Health Services Researchers in 2016. She completed her medical education at Northwestern, residency at Bellevue Hospital Center in New York City, and fellowship in Health Policy Research at Brigham and Women's Hospital. She completed a Master of Clinical Epidemiology degree at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health.





David A. McKenzie HONORARY MEMBERSHIP AWARD

David A. McKenzie served in the ACEP Reimbursement Department for almost thirty years. He was the staff contact for the AMA RVS Update Committee (RUC) and the CPT Editorial Panel. He attended both RUC and CPT meetings along with ACEP physician representatives to advocate on behalf of emergency medicine. Conservative estimates of the financial impact of his work in these areas over the years easily exceed \$30 billion new dollars for emergency physicians. He also coordinated the relevant educational material found on the ACEP website and is a nationally recognized speaker on ED Reimbursement and Coding.

Mr. McKenzie served as staff liaison for both the national ACEP Reimbursement and Coding and Nomenclature Advisory Committees and designed and implemented the Reimbursement Leadership Development Program for current and future Fellows. He served as the staff liaison for the ACEP Freestanding Emergency Center Section and numerous task forces. He is a nationally known expert on emergency medicine reimbursement and coding issues and has guided the content planning of the ACEP Reimbursement and Coding Courses and webinars.

Mr. McKenzie has given hundreds of hours of lectures at the national and chapter levels and is a frequent contributor to ACEP publications. He has twice been awarded the CPT Excellence in Education Award and is a two-time winner of the CPT Specialty Society Staff Liaison Excellence Award, the highest awards eligible for staff participants. He was recognized by the RUC Chair and received an unprecedented standing ovation at this last RUC meeting.

He was the 2024 recipient of the EDPMA Meritorious Service award, the first non-member to be so honored. He is most proud of the success of those members who collaborated with him through the years, 22 of whom have been recognized with national ACEP awards.





Rick Murray, EMT-P, FAEMS HONORARY MEMBERSHIP AWARD

Rick Murray, EMT-P, FAEMS, was Director of the EMS and Disaster Preparedness Department for ACEP for more than 26 years from 1996 to 2023. He directed the National EMS Week Campaign for ACEP since 1977. Mr. Murray served as the principal investigator or project manager for over 35 federal grant projects while at ACEP and is a Fellow of the Academy of EMS and serves on the Board of the National EMS Museum.

Mr. Murray has more than 48 years of experience in EMS, was one of the original Commission on Accreditation of Ambulance Services (CAAS) site reviewers and worked on the development of the initial CAAS standards. He was a field provider as an EMT and paramedic before working in leadership and administrative roles in a hospital-based system, private service and a fire-based system. He worked for a state EMS regulatory agency with the Texas Department of Health and then directed EMS training programs for both university and hospital-based training programs.

Mr. Murray received a Commendation from the ACEP Council in 2023 and was presented with the Paul E. Pepe, MD, Eagle Award for Outstanding National Contributions to Emergency Medical Services by the EMS Eagles Global Alliance in 2017. He also received the Friends of EMS Award from the National Association of EMS Physician (NAEMSP) in 2020, the ITLS Ambassador Award from International Trauma Life Support (ITLS) in 2016, the 1988 EMS Week Public Information Award from the Texas Department of Health and a Lifetime Achievement Award from the ACEP Section of Tactical and Law Enforcement Medicine in 2023.





Jim Slaughter, JD
HONORARY MEMBERSHIP AWARD

Jim Slaughter has served as ACEP Parliamentarian since 2001. He is an attorney and President of Law Firm Carolinas. Mr. Slaughter is a Certified Professional Parliamentarian-Teacher, Professional Registered Parliamentarian, and past President of the American College of Parliamentary Lawyers. He has served as Parliamentarian to many of the largest associations in the world. Mr. Slaughter has written four books on running effective meetings, including two updated for the new Robert's Rules: "Robert's Rules of Order Fast Track" and "Notes and Comments on Robert's Rules, Fifth Edition." Both books have been selected by Publisher's Weekly as "Editor's Picks," and Notes and Comments received the Phifer Award from the National Communication Association.

In addition to his professional work, Mr. Slaughter has led many civic and charitable organizations.
