## **Major Points Discussed**

**Current Activities** 

- A. Ms. Napper called the meeting to order.
- B. Dr. Finnell presented Ms. Halder with the 2024 Writing Award-Poetry for her piece, "Salve." He also presented Dr. Shenvi with the 2024 Writing Award-Prose for her piece, "My Suicide Blanket." Dr. Malik received the 2024 Visual Art Award for her painting, "Serene."
- C. Dr. Kaplan reported on the proceedings of the ACEP Council meeting and ACEP elections. The new president elect is Dr. Anthony (Tony) Cirillo; he has many years of service to ACEP. For the first time ever, the board elected members who are all women: Jennifer Casaletto, MD; C. Ryan Keay, MD; Heidi Knowles, MD; and Diana Nordlund, DO, JD. They are all supportive of the medical humanities. This year there were no specific resolutions that related to medical humanities. Dr. Kaplan did review a few resolutions that are applicable to our practice regarding termination of pregnancy, boarding, and workplace violence. He will do a summary for the next newsletter.
  - Dr. Kaplan would like to work with someone next year on a course proposal for ACEP25.
- D. In Dr. Balhara's stead, Ms. Napper gave an update on the white paper think tank. Over the past

year, section members who expressed interest have been working towards a consensus paper on humanities in emergency medicine. The group decided to use the nominal group technique to arrive at the primary questions of "what is the relevance of health humanities to emergency medicine and what are critical future directions?" The next panel meeting is tentatively scheduled for November 4. Dr. Kaplan wants to join the white paper think tank. Other interested members should contact Ms. Napper.
