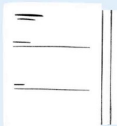

CV is:



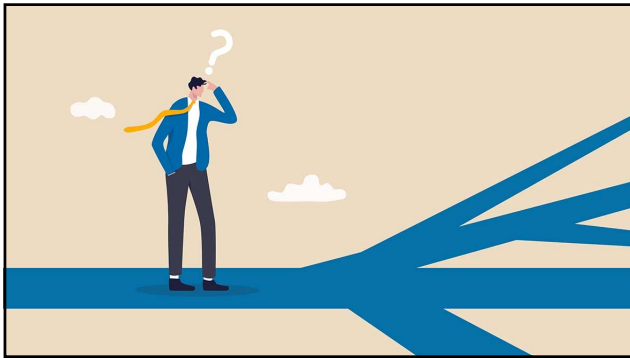
- ✓ CV has no length limit
- ✓ CV should detail the whole course of your career
- ✓ CVs are used for academic purposes

Resume is:



- ✓ Resume is one to two pages long
- ✓ Resume should only include those details about your work experience and skills that are relevant to the job opening
- ✓ Resumes are used to apply for jobs

"the NIH offers grants to academics for research on approved projects"

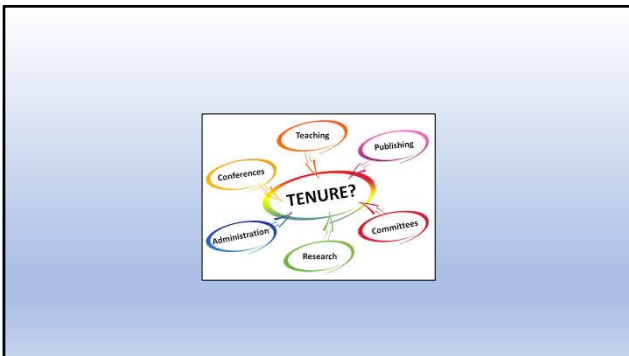

Core Faculty

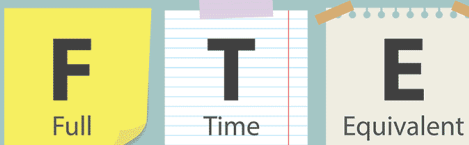

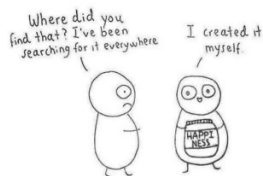
